# FLU & COVID-19 VACCINE CLINIC INFORMATION

### November 01 - November 12, 2022

Review these lists of participating pharmacies to see if you can receive the <u>COVID-19 vaccine</u> or the <u>Flu vaccine</u>, subject to availability. Be sure to **call the pharmacy ahead of time** if you plan to get vaccinated there, as vaccine supply varies and appointments may be required.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Information**



First or second doses: Anyone 6 months of age or older (wait at least eight weeks between doses).

**Booster doses:** Residents 5-11 years of age can receive a monovalent booster dose at the recommended interval of **six months** (168 days) after a previous COVID-19 vaccine (**on or before June 05, 2022**). A booster dose can be provided at a minimum of **three months** (84 days) after their last dose, with informed consent (**on or before Aug 14, 2022**).



<u>Bivalent booster doses</u>: Residents 12 years of age and older can receive the bivalent booster dose at a recommended interval of **six months** (168 days) after a previous COVID-19 vaccine (**on or before June 05**, **2022**). A bivalent booster dose can be provided at a minimum of **three months** (84 days) after their last dose, with informed consent (**on or before Aug 14, 2022**). IMPORTANT: Children 6 months to 4 years of age can receive other vaccines 14 days prior to or after receiving a COVID-19 vaccine (cannot receive COVID-19 and flu vaccine at same time).

Walk-ins are accepted at all clinics except Novavax clinics (appointments required).

#### Flu Vaccine Information

**Everyone 6 months of age and older** should get the standard quadrivalent inactivated vaccine (QIV) every year, unless there is a medical reason not to.

If you're 65 years of age or older, there are different flu options available:

- The **standard-dose** (QIV) vaccine protects against four strains of flu virus (for anyone 6 months of age or older).
- The **high-dose** vaccine also protects against four strains of flu virus, but in higher doses. Seniors can choose from **2 different types of high-dose vaccines:**
- 1. **High dose QIV**, which contains higher amount of antigen per strain the standard dose.
- 2. **Trivalent Inactivated Vaccine (TIV)** protects against two different flu A viruses and one flu B virus.
