Protecting Patients and Health Care Workers

COVID-19 CONSIDERATIONS

- Mask use is **mandatory** within 2 metres of another individual. Special consideration should be given in an office setting, as unintentional contact with coworkers remains a risk.
- Primary care providers are encouraged to continue with virtual and/or telephone consultations, when and where appropriate.
- In-person care is essential for certain conditions and some patients cannot fully benefit from virtual care. Primary care providers should continue to exercise clinical judgement to determine whether an in-person visit is necessary.
- For patients who screen *negative*, in-person care must be provided using a surgical mask. Eye protection must be considered based on risk assessment.
- For patients who screen *positive*, in-person care may be provided following Droplet/Contact precautions using mask, eye protection, gown and gloves.

CLEANING & DISINFECTING

Cleaning: physically removes, rather than kills, visible soiling (dust, blood, mucus). It is completed with water, detergent and friction.

Disinfecting: kills viruses and bacteria.

- All visibly soiled surfaces must be cleaned before disinfected.
- Ensure multi-use equipment is not used with another client until it has been properly cleaned and disinfected. Do not re-use single use items.
- Regular cleaning and disinfecting logs are encouraged with the responsibility for cleaning clearly assigned.

Recommended Cleaning Frequencies	
Shared Equipment (stethoscopes, bp cuffs, otoscopes)	Between each patient
Horizontal Surfaces (counters, tables)	After a person presented with respiratory symptoms leaves and at least twice daily
Frequently touched surfaces (doorknobs, light switches, telephones, keyboards/mice, pens, charts, cell phones, toys)	At least twice daily
General cleaning of exam room (chairs, tables, floors)	At least twice daily



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TIPS AND TRICKS

- Clean visibly soiled surfaces before disinfecting (unless otherwise stated on product)
- Follow product instructions for dilution and wet contact time
- Ready-to-use wipes and pre-made solutions can be used
- Bleach mixtures are required to be mixed daily
- WHMIS sheets (SDS) must be available for all cleaning and disinfecting agents
- Protect your skin, use gloves
- Agents effective against COVID-19: bleach (sodium hypochlorite), hydrogen peroxide, quaternary ammonium compounds (QUATS)
- Ensure the product has an 8-digit DIN to indicate it has been approved for use by Health Canada
